Literacy

Stories from the African culture 2 traditional fairy tales (*Princess and the Pea, Rapunzel*) Children will use these ideas to re-write their own stories thinking about painting a picture in the readers mind and taking the time to describe.

Horrible Histories Remake – children will remake their own horrible histories thinking about the tenses we can write in.

Maths

Measurement: Time

Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.

Know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day.

Compare and sequence intervals of time.

Measurement: Capacity,

volume and temperature
Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure capacity (litres/ml) and temperature (oC) to the nearest appropriate unit, using thermometers and measuring vessels.

Compare and order volume/capacity and record.


Science

Children will learn about key life cycles of plants and animals. They will learn about the oldest plants in history and compare them to others. What makes this plants so hardy? How can we best look after these plants? Can we design a garden fit for a queen? Can we maintain a garden for a queen? Lots of experiments and observations will be made to ensure plants able to thrive. Planting a garden fit for the queen with our new knowledge will encourage the children to observe, experiment and apply their scientific skills.

Physical Education

Children will taught how to engages in competitive games against both themselves and others in a range of challenging situations considering and developing simple tactics for defending and attacking.

Curriculum Enrichment

Royal Celebrations – children will celebrate the queen's birthday by going back in time to the year she began her reign.

Computing

Children will build on their use of internet as a secondary source. Children will use simple search engines to research key historical figures and events. They will design their own websites and record news beat videos summarising their new knowledge.

Humanities

History Monarchs will be explored and life in different periods will be compared to modern day society. This will link to our British values and how we have learnt from history to form the very values today.

Music

Children will listen to music through the ages and explore different sounds. They will focus on pitch and the different types of instruments used. Children will investigate the types of sounds a range of instruments make and create their own ensemble using the skills from graphic scoring and their knowledge of instruments.

Design (Art / Technology)

Clarice Cliff forms the focus of the art learnings during this term. Children will investigate her works and look at colour, pattern and media. Through decoupage, painting, collage and drawing children will design and create a piece of art in the style of Clarice Cliff.

Religious Education

Children get the opportunity to explore how different religions celebrate life events e.g. weddings, welcoming new life. This links strongly to our British Values of mutual respect and toleration.
