



Dear parent/carer,

Further to our communication on Friday, 13th March 2020, we have decided to postpone and/or cancel indefinitely all upcoming events and meetings up to the end of the spring term with immediate effect. This means the following events are cancelled/postponed:

- Mothers' Day lunch (this is cancelled, money will be refunded)
- All parent class assemblies (class assemblies will take place during summer)
- Parent consultation evenings (these will be rescheduled during the summer)
- Y4 Condover Hall parent briefing (this is postponed and we will be seeking advice with regards to this residential trip moving forward)
- Spring Sing
- Chocolate Bingo
- Dance club performances for parents
- Rock Steady concert

We intend, for the time being, to continue running after school clubs. If we close early we will complete missed club sessions when it is safe to do so. A decision will be made on events due to take place after the Easter holidays in due course.

We would like to request that, where possible, parents/carers email class teachers with any requests in order to minimise time spent in the building. However, we understand that in some circumstances, this may not be possible. Please be aware that due to the rapidly developing situation, it may not be possible to reply and/or deal with issues immediately. Our school office are also very busy answering your calls and queries and therefore we request your patience and understanding.

In the event of a school closure, as per our previous communication, teachers will distribute a selection of learning for children to complete and some will be sent out via ParentMail/school website as and when deemed necessary and depending on the length of any closure.

We remind you of the advice given by Public Health England:

To support the delay of the spread of the virus, the Department for Health and Social Care has asked anyone who shows certain symptoms to stay at home for 7 days, regardless of whether they have travelled to affected areas. This means people should stay at home and avoid all but essential contact with others for 7 days from the point of displaying mild symptoms, to slow the spread of infection.

The symptoms are:

- *A high temperature (37.8 degrees and above)*
- *A new, continuous cough*

We are so sorry for all the disruption and disappointment this may cause but in these unprecedented times we feel it is the sensible and correct thing to do.
