Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you again everyone for all your continued support and communications.

It has been a really nice week in school with a few more key worker children back. We have felt a step towards feeling more normal and all of the children have been coping really well with our new hygiene and social distancing rules. We have been really impressed with their positive attitudes and cheeriness. Please could I ask children don't bring homemade face coverings into school as our guidance and risk assessment is clear that these used incorrectly can cause more risk than not wearing them.

We hope those of you still home learning are managing to cope. We know as this crisis goes on a lot longer than we had all anticipated, home learning will become harder to keep going for some. We do hope the on line resources we are providing continue to be useful and engaging for your children. The teachers are working hard to make sure the teaching material is accessible, purposeful and supportive of those key skills. Each learning zone has a link to the class teacher's email address. Please do use this link to give your child's teacher regular updates, share success and ask for any further guidance or clarification should you need it.

I continue to meet regularly with our Uttoxeter Learning partnership colleagues and together with our Governors and staff we are reviewing the guidance and advice continually. We are very busy refining all plans, procedures and risk assessments to ensure we have everything in place to reopen as soon as we can. I will of course let you know as and when we can start accepting more children.
